

Training Report 2017

In January - Le Verger's training program was visited by the Accreditation Review Team, and was once again successfully accredited for the next three years.

Two students from the UK came to Le Verger for the Basic Course. One of them has since been regularly coming to Le Verger to work, and become a part of Le Verger's Christian Science nursing team.



In February, Andrea Landart went to Kampala, Uganda, where she gave the Basic Course to Fredy who came from Tanzania, and Angèle who came from Cameroon, and junior who came from the DRC for training. They have since been very active in their fields in Africa.


